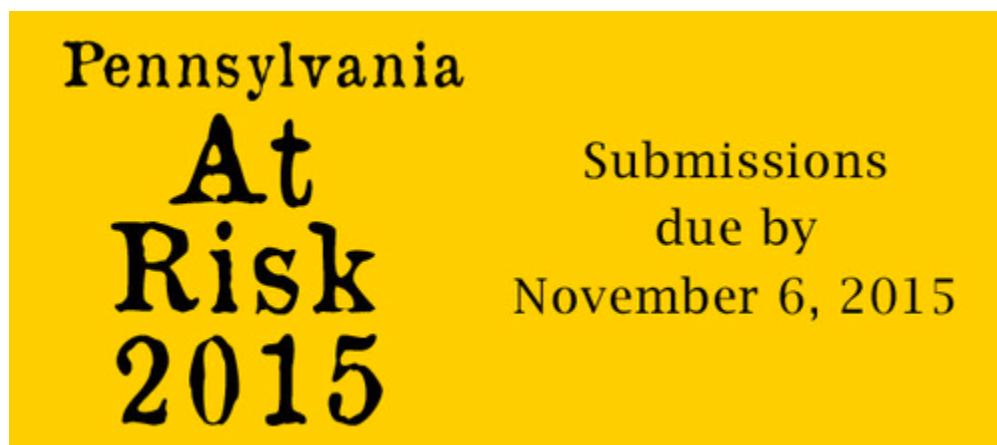

there are sites like Philadelphia's Boyd Theater (photo at right) where the news is mixed (the beautiful Art Deco auditorium was demolished; the facade, vestibule and lobby will remain).
