IMMEDIATE ACTION NEEDED! **Demolition Permit Filed for Pennsylvania At Risk 2004 Property Friday, December 17th Deadline**

The Heidelberg (Kerlin Farm) property, located in Cheltenham Township, Montgomery County, is on the verge of demolition unless a preservation-minded person or organization agrees to purchase it by December 17th.

On November 29, 2010, the property's current owner, a developer, applied for a demolition permit. Although the owner is reportedly willing to consider purchase offers, the demolition will not be delayed.

Therefore, unless a buyer is identified by December 17th, the circa 1682 stone house (*above right*) along with its 1790 addition (*right*), its 1850 and 1898
